

NEW ZEALAND CERTIFICATE IN BUILDING, CONSTRUCTION AND ALLIED TRADE SKILLS (LEVEL 1)

This programme is for those intending to gain an introduction to basic skills relevant to the building, construction and allied trades sector.

Graduates will have foundation knowledge and skills relevant to a wide range of trade occupations. This programme is not intended to recognise the level of commercial competence required for trade professionals but will give ākonga a solid foundation should they choose to embark on further trade related training or an apprenticeship.

Ākonga will be able to apply knowledge to perform construction tasks and complete BCATS projects under supervision. Graduates will have completed their projects in a range of construction and allied trades learning environments such as workshops, training establishment facilities, outdoor areas or industry sites through simulated workplace settings.
